BEFORE YOU START


- Remember your building may look different based on a variety of factors such as UV exposure, wind, rain, freeze-thaw damage, prior maintenance, construction methods, and material types.

WHAT TO LOOK FOR

Look for these signs of water intrusion:

- Organic growth
- Buildup of debris
- Staining
- Discoloration
- Corrosion

- Cracking
- Swelling & bulging
- Condensation
- Peeling paint
